



Students currently in Biology, Algebra I and 10th grade English DO NOT need to sign up. You are automatically registered for the Keystone Exams.





No student can participate in a spring sport without a full PIAA physical. Recertification forms may be used for spring if athletes had full physicals for a fall or winter sport. The Parkland Athletic Department understands that it may not be convenient to come to our scheduled free physical event. However, those who miss must get a PIAA physical on their own prior to March 1, 2023.

Paperwork for the physical is on the <u>PHS website</u>. All Parkland athletes must get an ImPACT test once during their four years at PHS and before participation.

#### Flu Season

The Flu Season continues to be in full swing through April and this season is complicated by the many viral respiratory illnesses that are prevalent. It is recommended that your student receive their flu vaccine at this time, please check with your doctor.

#### Guidelines for Sending your Child to School

To help stay healthy and decrease the spread of illness in the school, we are encouraging all families to adhere to the following guidelines for sending your child to school.

Please keep your child home from school (even if they have a test or sporting event) if he or she is experiencing any of the following symptoms:

- Fever of 100 degrees or more
- Vomiting/Diarrhea
- Severe head cold
- Persistent cough
- Severe sore throat

These are the same criteria the Health Room uses as a guideline when sending students home ill from school.

Students should not return to school until they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications.



#### JUNIORS Physical Forms Due

All eleventh-grade students should return their physicals to the Health Room as soon as possible.

#### Immunization Requirement


The Meningitis Vaccine is required on or after a student turns 16 years old. Students in grade 11 will be required to have this immunization on the first day of their senior year. The grade 11 physical is a good time to be sure this immunization is completed.

#### SOPHOMORES Physical Choice Form Due

All students in grade 10 will soon receive paperwork for completing their mandated physical for grade 11. This can be done at the time your student gets their physical for their driver's permit but may not be completed before July 1, 2022. The form for the school physical you receive is the preferable paperwork to be completed. However, copies of the physical forms used for the driver's permit are accepted for the student's school physical. Please return the Choice Form to the Health Room as soon as possible to indicate how the physical will be completed.

#### Two Key Laws Teen Drivers Must Follow in Pennsylvania

Although most states have similar rules of the road, it is important to know the basics of what is expected while driving in each state that you visit. The two key laws in Pennsylvania are the Texting-While-Driving Ban and the Steer Clear law.

#### Texting-While-Driving Ban

According to Pennsylvania law, drivers are prohibited from using a handheld communication device to read, write or send text communication while the vehicle is in motion. According to a AAA poll, 94 percent of teen drivers acknowledge the dangers of texting and driving but 35 percent admitted to doing it anyway.

#### Steer Clear Law

Another important law to know is the Steer Clear law (or Move Over law). When there is an incident on the side of the road, like an accident, construction workers, emergency vehicles or a driver pulled over by a State Trooper, Pennsylvania motorists are required to move at least one lane in between the incident and traffic. If you are unable to move over to create a safe space cushion, you are required to slow down.

#### Teen Driver Cell Phone Statistics

- 21 percent of teen drivers involved in fatal accidents were distracted by their cell phones.
- Teen drivers are 4 times more likely than adults to get into car crashes or near-crashes when talking or texting.



Nearly 50,000 people are injured or killed around U.S. Transportation job sites each year, according to the Federal Highway Administration. Many of these involved the motoring public traveling at unsafe speeds.


Nearly all of these incidents were avoidable. In 2020 alone, 15 people were killed in crashes in Pennsylvania work zones, according to PennDOT data.



After successfully completing the Driver Theory Course, your child will receive a certificate that should be filed in a safe place. A copy of this certificate is needed if your child wishes to take the Behind-the-Wheel instruction. You should also submit a copy to your insurance company when your new driver is added to your policy. Many insurance companies offer discounted rates with proof of course completion.
