Dear Parents:

The PHS school year is off to a wonderful start! The students have been extremely focused on their academics and a positive energy fills the building. Thank you for visiting our Open House, which we are proud to say over 1,200 parents attended. We know the importance parental support holds in the academic success of a student. I would also like to thank you for your commitment in maintaining a strong school and home partnership.

Homecoming week kicks off starting on Monday, October 7 through Friday, October 11. Each day has a theme to generate positive energy and boost school spirit. Homecoming's theme for this year is "Sharing is Caring" with proceeds supporting our own Parkland Caring Closet. Homecoming week kicks off with the Garter Bowl at 6 PM on Thursday, October 10 in the Orefield Stadium. For any student preparing to retake a Keystone Exam this year, PHS will be holding Keystone "Boot Camps" to review important test content in Algebra, Biology, and Literature. These camps will begin at various times in mid-October and if your child is eligible to retest you will receive an invitation letter noting specific areas to focus on in preparation for the Exams. We are very proud of our summer Keystone remediation program's success and we encourage students to attend the Boot Camps in preparation for retesting.

Our career education programming kicks off this year with our Career Speaker series for 9th & 10th grade students from October 21-November 22. Talk to your student to see which careers he/she has signed up to learn about. Juniors and Seniors will be preparing this year for the Job Fair to be held later in February. COUNSELING CORNER

COLLEGE-BOUND SOPHOMORES AND JUNIORS

On Saturday, October 19, 2019 the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) will be administered at Parkland High School. We strongly encourage all college bound sophomores and juniors to take the PSAT, which is designed to prepare students for the SAT. PSAT registration for juniors and sophomores started in September. Late PSAT registrations are charged \$27, and no late registrations will be accepted after October 9. Please remember October 19 is the only date the PSAT/NMSQT can be administered to students at Parkland High School for the 2019-20 school year. Juniors planning to take the SAT I: Reasoning Test should register for the PSAT/NMSQT, since it will provide an excellent review of the writing, reading and mathematical reasoning skills needed for later testing. The PSAT/NMSQT score is not posted on the high school transcript and therefore is an excellent opportunity to practice for future SAT Reasoning and SAT Subject tests. As a junior, students taking the PSAT may also qualify for National Merit Scholarships.

Sophomores are encouraged to take the PSAT as an opportunity to practice critical reading, writing and math problem solving skills. However, sophomores are not eligible for any merit scholarships. Please contact your child's guidance counselor if you have any questions regarding the PSAT and/or SAT offered by the College Board. FAFSA (FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID) UPDATE

The FAFSA is the most important form to complete in order to qualify for most types of financial aid including federal, state, local and private grants and scholarships. The FAFSA becomes available to current seniors on October 1, 2019. Families will use "prior-prior" year tax information (2018) to complete the FAFSA. The form can be accessed online at www.FAFSA.gov.

PARCHMENT EXCHANGE — ELECTRONIC TRANSCRIPT SYSTEM

Parkland High School partners with Parchment Exchange, a service offering new technology to deliver electronic transcripts (eTranscripts) to many colleges, scholarship organizations, the military, NCAA Clearinghouse, and employers worldwide. **Current students should never be charged a fee for transcript requests through Parchment Exchange.** If Parchment asks for your credit card information, please log out of the system and bring your request directly to the Counseling Office. VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

It is hard to believe that we are already saying goodbye to September and welcoming in October. What is even more amazing is the fact that the A-wing has begun to perform and create for the public. It will be an extremely busy month.

THEATER — FALL PRODUCTION

The theatrical season begins with performances of this year's fall play, *Museum*. The play takes place on the final day of a group show of three fictitious contemporary American artists being exhibited in a major museum of modern art. In the course of the day some forty people walk through the show: art lovers, skeptics, foreigners, students, lost souls, fellow artists and, of course, museum guards. The play is about the movement and yearning of these people and asks the question, *"What is Art?"* The play will be presented on Friday, October 4 and Saturday, October 5 at 7:30 PM, with matinee performances on October 5 and October 6 at 3 PM. Due to the nature of this production, it will take place in the Black Box rehearsal/performance space. This is the first time in 20 years that a full production will be performed in that venue. Seating will be limited to approximately 140 per show and all seating is general admission. Tickets for this and all of the other PHS Theatrical Productions are available online. Tickets for *Museum* will be available at the door one hour before curtain. Tickets are \$11 for adults and \$9 for students and senior citizens (65+). This production is recommended for audiences 14 years and older.

The 2019 family show will be the classic **Disney's Beauty and the Beast, Jr.** This "tale as old as time" features all of the favorite songs from the original animated film along with ones created especially for the stage show. Join Belle, Gaston, Lumiere, Mrs. Potts and the rest of the familiar characters as they sing and dance their way to become "Human Again." Songs like "Be Our Guest," "Gaston," and "Beauty and the Beast" are all part of this special Disney experience. MARK YOUR SPORTS CALENDAR!

Winter Season 2019-2020 sports physicals will be held Saturday, October 19, 2019 at Parkland High School. Girls 8–9:30 AM, Boys 9:30–11 AM. They are free.

No student can participate in basketball, swimming or wrestling without a full PIAA physical. Recertification forms may be used for winter if athletes had full physicals for the fall of 2019. The Parkland Athletic Department understands that it may not be convenient to come to our scheduled free physical event. However, those who miss must get a PIAA physical on their own prior to **November 18, 2019**. Paperwork for this is on the <u>https://www.parklandsd.org/</u> website under Departments - Athletics - Forms. All Parkland High School athletes must get an ImPACT test once during their 4 years at PHS, before trying out for their first sport. **The first day of winter sports is Monday, November 18.**

INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

Now that the school year is in full swing, the Health Room would like to remind you of some important information.

FLU SEASON AND GUIDELINES FOR ILLNESS

The flu season occurs from October through April. Check with your doctor about getting the flu vaccine for your student. To help stay healthy and decrease the spread of illness in the school, we are encouraging all families to adhere to the following guidelines for sending your child to school: **Please keep your child home from school if he/she is experiencing any of the following symptoms:**

- Fever of 100 degrees or more
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Severe head cold
- Persistent cough
- Severe sore throat

It is advised that a student should be fever free for twenty-four hours before returning to school. Please remind your student that cell phone use is prohibited during the school day, and if they are feeling ill they should come to the Health Room for evaluation.

COLD AND ALLERGY

JUNIORS

11th GRADE PHYSICALS

All eleventh grade students should return their physicals to the Health Room as soon as possible. Forms are available on the <u>PHS website</u>.

NEW IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT

The Meningitis Vaccine is required on or after the student's $16^{\rm th}$ birthday.

Students in the 11^{th} grade will be required to have this immunization on the first day of their senior year. The 11^{th} grade physical is a good time to be sure this immunization is completed.

Please be advised that the Health Room **does not** have cold or allergy medications. If your student has cold symptoms or allergies, please medicate as needed before or after school.

MEDICATION

Emergency medications (epinephrine auto injectors and asthma inhalers) may be carried by the student during the school day if the **physician indicates this on the Medication Form (this form needs to be returned to the Health Room).** Carrying emergency medications at the high school level is encouraged because of the many activities the students are involved in. Students who need medication during the school day will need to submit a parent authorization **and** a physician's order for prescription or over the counter medications. **All medication, prescription and nonprescription, must be brought to the school by a parent and/or guardian**. TIPS FOR TEACHING YOUR CHILD HOW TO **BECOME A GOOD DEFENSIVE DRIVER**

Use your car as a classroom Ask your child questions about the meaning of signs, signals, and pavement markings you see. Draw their attention to both safe and unsafe actions of other drivers to help them understand how to avoid accidents caused by other drivers' mistakes.

Use YouTube as a resource and search for 'Faces of Distracted Driving'. You will find hundreds of short stories (approximately 3 minutes long) of accidents caused by texting and driving. Try to put you/your family in the described situations and talk about how an accident like this would affect you and change your life. Make the promise to your child that you will not drive distracted and have them do the same.

Talk About Driver Education Theory If you have a child currently enrolled in the 10th grade Driver Ed Theory course, ask them 'what did you talk about in class this week?' If they say 'nothing', ask to see their folders which should be up-to-date with the units we have covered to spark conversation.




